Possible Sequence for First Eight Weeks of Second Grade Writers' Workshop

NOTE

- Teaching topics (mini-lessons) are guided by formative assessment.
- The number of mini-lesson topics you cover is bounded by the number of times you run a Writers' Workshop session per week. If you do it four times a week, you can teach twice as many mini-lessons than if you do it two times per week.
- Writers' Workshop is recursive, meaning mini-lessons are meant to be repeated at regular intervals and skills are meant to be practiced and then practiced again, and it's all guided by formative assessment).
